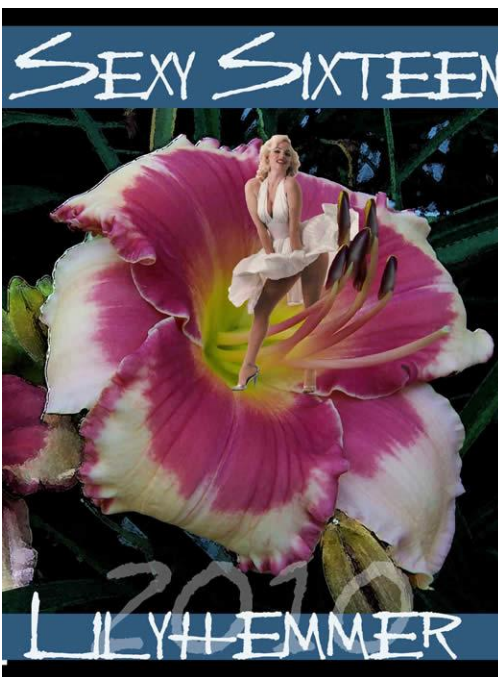
#### Lilyhemmer 2010

2010 Richmond Flower Show – DIVISION IV: DESIGN – “Wonderland”

These are the first place results from the RADS flower show held in June.

**Section 1: Down the Rabbit-Hole”**  
*(Eligible for the AHS Tricolor rosette and AHS Tricolor Medal)* One or more open daylilies must be used in the design and should be the predominant flowers.

**Class A: “Oh my ears and whiskers, how late it’s getting!” – White Rabbit – Traditional Mass Design**  
incorporating the use of a timepiece.



**Class B: “Curiouser and curiouser” – Alice – Creative Design.**

**Class C: “I can’t explain myself, I’m afraid, Sir, because I’m not myself, you see.” – Alice – Stretch Design** *(A Creative Design in two units, one smaller than the other, having a prominent component connecting the two units and referred to as the “stretch component.”)*





**Section 2: “We’re All Mad Here” Cheshire Cat** - (Eligible for the AHS Designer’s Choice rosette(purple) One or more open daylilies must be used in the design and should be the predominant flowers.

**Class D:** “Well! I’ve often seen a cat without a grin; but a grin without a cat! It’s the most curious thing I’ve ever seen in my life!” – Alice – **Transparency Design** (A Creative Design including see-through element(s) that permit some components to be viewed through others.)

**Class E:** “Mad Hatters Tea Party” – **Exhibition Table Type 1 Design.**

**Class F:** “Begin at the beginning and go on till you come to the end: then stop.” – The King of Hearts – **Multi-Rhythmic Design** (A Creative Design with emphasis on two or more rhythms in the design.)
