# **Recipe Corner**

### At the April Meeting Carole Brown brought a wonderful Carrot Soufflé!

Serves 6. This recipe can easily be doubled.

#### **Carrot Soufflé**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1-pound carrots peeled and sliced, or frozen
- 3 eggs
- ½ cup butter (1 stick)
- 1 to 1 ½ tsp vanilla
- ¾ cup sugar
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- ½ tsp salt
- 1 tsp baking powder

#### **Directions**

- 1. Place carrots in a medium saucepan of boiling water. Bring water to boil again and cook for 15 to 20 minutes.
- 2. When carrots are soft, drain and let cool. Add carrots to a large bowl and mash with a potato masher until only very fine lumps remain.
- 3. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 4. Add 3 eggs, ½ cup butter (1 stick) and 1 tsp vanilla. (I like to add an extra ½ tsp.) Mix well.
- 5. In a separate bowl, mix: ¾ cup sugar (I used 2/3 cup, you can substitute Stevia.) 3 Tbsp. all-purpose flour, ½ tsp salt, and 1 tsp baking powder.
- 6. Add the dry mix to the wet mix and whip together well.
- 7. Pre-coat bottom and sides of a 1quart baking dish with butter or oil to prevent serious sticking. Pour mixture into buttered baking dish size.
- 8. Bake in oven for 45 minutes or until set. As the soufflé cools it will "fall" a bit.
- 9. Optionally you can sprinkle cinnamon on top.
